A note from Mrs McNeil...

It is great to be sending out a newsletter to keep everyone informed of what has been happening in our school since our return in August. We have welcomed many new families into our South Park community and almost all children now have a heart on the South Park tree at our main entrance. It was great to welcome so many families into the school last week and as you will see from the diary dates there are many occasions this session where we will be able to come together to share learning. I have given these out so you can plan if you require time off work but please be advised we may have to change dates from time to time for various reasons. Thank you to everyone for the constant support for our school and nursery, please remember I am always available at the school if you wish to discuss any concerns.

Home Learning

Following our recent consultation of parent/carers/ pupils and staff we have amended our home learning policy. The children will all be issued with tasks to be completed on a Monday of each week. For P1-P3 these tasks will be mostly practical and be in the red home learning bags. The bags must be returned the following Monday morning so that new tasks can be distributed. P4-P7 will be given literacy and numeracy tasks in their home learning jotters and the tasks should be completed at a time that suits the family. The home learning jotters should be returned every Monday. Posted on the school app at the beginning of each term will be suggested home learning activities to supplement the home learning literacy and numeracy tasks. Many of the supplemented activities build the children's essential life skills. The new approach to home learning is a trial and will be reviewed in January 24 where we will measure the impact and engagement of home learning.
